

DOCUMENTATION OF DELEGATE SELECTION IN WASHINGTON STATE

Ballots for the Green Party presidential nomination were sent by postal mail to Green Party of Washington State members on Saturday after our Spring Convention on 5 May with instructions that the ballots must be postmarked by 26 May to be valid. On 31 May the votes were tallied to determine the preferences of Washington State Green Party members for the nomination for President at the Presidential Nominating Convention.

WA had four candidates for our four delegate position, as well as two candidates for alternate positions. The delegates and alternates ballots were postal mailed with the ballots for the presidential nomination. All delegates and alternates were elected, but subsequently one delegate and one alternate announced that they will be unable to attend the Presidential Nominating Convention. The State Coordinating Council declared the four who were elected as the four delegates for Washington.

In the first round of voting, WA apportions delegates among the candidates seeking the presidential nomination by proportioning our four votes to reflect the votes cast by our members. Delegates are not bound to vote proportionately in subsequent rounds.

Jill Stein received all but one of the first choice votes and will, therefore, receive four votes in the first round of voting.
